Engl 479 A Romantic Moderns--Lyricism & the Longer Lyric

Romanticism, as a moment in time and as a literary movement, is associated with early nineteenth-century English poetry and prose and, later, with American Transcendentalism. At the center of this Romantic idealism is the notion of the primacy and power of the sympathetic imagination, as both an individual and universal principle. Although we will focus on modernist, post-modernist and contemporary versions of Anglo-American Romanticism, we will also lay groundwork for what Romanticism is and in whose work it first came to be.

Blake says that "To Generalize is to be an Idiot. To Particularize is the Alone Distinction of Merit." Nevertheless, here are some general distinctions:
